COURSE SUMMARY

The New Zealand Diploma in Business (NZDipBus) is a national business qualification which covers a broad range of business disciplines and is well recognised by employers. The New Zealand Diploma in Business may also provide a pathway to university degree courses with a number of universities awarding a considerable number of cross-credits.

Domestic entry requirements

If you are less than 20 years old you must have the following credits and attend a personal interview. You may need to provide your school report and/or current resume. A minimum of 14 numeracy credits at level 1 or higher in Mathematics or Pangarau on the National Qualifications Framework: and fifty credits at level 2 or above with at least 12 credits in each of three subjects including a minimum of 8 literacy credits at level 2 or higher in English or Te Reo Maori; 4 credits must be in reading and 4 credits must be in writing. The literacy credits will be selected from a schedule of approved achievement standards and unit standards. The schedule may be found on the NZQA website at: Literacy requirements for University Entrance or equivalent to the above.

If you are 20 years of age or over, you must pass the Crown entry test and attend a personal interview. You may need to provide your current resume.

University links form the New Zealand Diploma of Business

MASSEY GATEWAY

Unilink Gateway: This pathway allows you to enter Year 1 of the Massey University BBS degree. You must complete at least four Crown NZ Dip.Bus papers, with a minimum B grade pass mark in each paper.

If you have completed the NZ Dip.Bus with a B grade average you will gain entry with up to 45 points of credit towards the BBIM, Bcom or BProp degree, based on a B grade in approved courses. With less than a B grade average you will be considered for entry but will not be eligible for credit. Eligibility is assessed on a case-by-case basis.

AUT

If you have completed the NZDip.Bus (twelve papers) or have an incomplete NZDip.Bus with a pass in a minimum of six papers you may be eligible for entry to AUT. Eligibility is assessed on a case-by-case basis.

UNIVERSITY OF AUCKLAND

If you have completed the NZ Dip.Bus with a B grade average you will gain entry with up to 45 points of credit towards the BBIM, Bcom or BProp degree, based on a B grade in approved courses. With less than a B grade average you will be considered for entry but will not be eligible for credit. Eligibility is assessed on a case-by-case basis.
